Challenge 2 - Persuasive Writing

Persuasive Writing uses convincing language to win a reader over to a certain idea. The following features are always included:

- Headings to capture the reader's interest-*Do you love adventure?*
- Descriptions with exciting adjectives-*Spectacular sunsets*
- Powerful verbs and adverbs-*Flying Fearlessly*
- Rhetorical Questions (questions we don't expect to answer) - *What could be better?*



Challenge 3 - Observational Art


